ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

The Administrator has moved to dismiss the notice of appeal in this proceeding because it was not, as required by Section 821.47 of the Board's Rules of Practice (49 CFR Part 821), filed

§ 821.47 Notice of Appeal.

A party may appeal from a law judge's order or from the initial decision by filing with the Board and serving upon the other parties (pursuant to §821.8) a notice of appeal within 10 days after an oral initial decision or an order has been served.

¹Section 821.47 provides as follows:

by the respondent within 10 days after the law judge issued an order on October 22, 1997, granting summary judgment for the Administrator. We will grant the motion, to which respondent has submitted no answer.

Absent a showing of good cause that would provide a basis for excusing the lateness of the notice, respondent's appeal must be dismissed. See <u>Administrator v. Hooper</u>, NTSB Order EA-2781 (1988).

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The Administrator's motion to dismiss is granted, and
- 2. The respondent's appeal is dismissed.
